Giving should be a sacrifice, but only you can decide. One thing is certain. Our God promises that our generosity will be returned to us many times over in ways that will delight us.

All Saints Day

On this day we honor all the saints, not just those who have been officially recognized by the church through canonization. 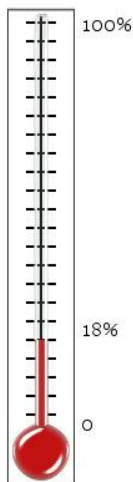
