The Saturday after Ascension is celebrated as the feast of Mary Queen of Apostles. On May 31 the Visitation of Mary is celebrated in the churches of the United States. In general the month of May is dedicated to special devotions to the Blessed Virgin Mary. In churches and in homes the images of Mary are decorated with flowers in May and the children have a unique role in this tradition of the Church.

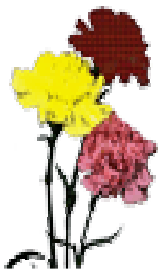
