From Mom

Thank you to Fr. Jim and parish secretary, Ann Adler, for making possible another letter from among those my mother sent during my years at St. Bernard's Seminary. Much has changed since 1958. I hope mom's experience connects at least in some ways with women reading it in 2017 as we honor them on Mother's Day.

Monday P.M. [December 1, 1958]

Dear Roy,

We all enjoyed your letter to Robert [my kid brother] telling of your Thanksgiving dinner. [We were not allowed to go home for Thanksgiving.] You and Tom didn't do too badly on the [bridge] tournament considering how little you play. After all you didn't come in last. Did Marc and Ernie play? If they did, I suppose those two sharks ran off with the prize.

Mrs. C. says you boys are starving down there. Is that true? Do you want me to send additional food beside the apples. I am really not too concerned because I have heard that story before. But I don't want you hungry either.

We had all the family over on Thanksgiving for dinner at 4:30. Our turkey was very good. We still have a leg left, but I am sick of looking at it and nibbling on it. Those Wiesner boys [my cousins] sure can eat.

The Rosary society at St. James is having their Christmas party next Monday. My band has been chosen to work, so I have been very busy calling and making arrangements. Friday night is the Cub Scout Christmas party at Pardee [School]. They asked me to bake some cookies. Yesterday I baked them and froze some for them. A few extra you will find in your laundry case. [Dad dropped off and picked up my laundry each week on his way to work at nearby Kodak Park.]

This is Dad's long weekend starting Saturday so we are looking forward to coming down to Mass either Sun. or Mon. Does the day matter? I would rather come Sun. as I expect to be very busy Mon. Send a note and let us know which day is better for you and what we are supposed to do. [Started living at St. Bernard's just a few months before. Visitors were allowed for High Masses on Sundays and Holydays. In 1958 the Feast of the Immaculate Conception came on Monday.]

Now, Roy don't you go spending all your money for Christmas presents. It is not necessary and you give us things that money cannot buy. But if you insist, please take it easy.

I was envying you yesterday morning – not having to go out of your building to go to Mass. Dad was going to shovel the drive before Mass to get the car out and I told him we could walk as I didn't want him doing all that heavy shoveling on an empty stomach. [In 1958 the Communion fast started at midnight.] So, of course, we walked over. It really wasn't too bad, In fact, coming home the snow had stopped, the sun came out, the wind was on our back and it was rather pleasant. Especially since it was such a short walk.

I will make the day of Recollection with the St. Monica Sodality on Dec. 15th. Mrs. C. called me this morning. Also asked to have us deliver the envelope to Ernie [her seminarian son] in your laundry.

Skippy [pet dog] has been sick and the folks on Bay St. have been busy arguing over what to do for him Personally I think he was over-treated with those nurses trying out their remedies on him. [Aunt] Mary doctored him with Milk of Magnesia and whiskey. I don't know what John and Joe [Mary's brothers; Joe, mom's widower father] did, but I am sure they must have tried something. He seems to be better now, as he barks again when someone comes calling.

Robert talks a lot about you lately. Absence makes the heart grow fonder. I sure hope it works the same for Noreen if she should go out of town to college. She is sending in an application to Le Moyne this week. One of her advisors at school thinks she should go to Le Moyne. As she told Noreen, "You can't beat the Jesuits for their teaching and it also a good place to get a M.R.S." Noreen asked me what a M.R.S. degree was and I told her I thought it was probably a Mrs. before her name. So, of course, who wants a B.S. or any other degree if you can get a M.R.S. Only kidding. [In 1963 Noreen got a B.S., but from Rosary Hill (now Daemen) in Buffalo. A few months later she and a graduate of nearby Niagara became Mrs. & Mr.]

My hand is getting weary [Several paragraphs have been omitted here.] and my poor brain empty, so

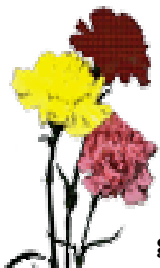

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ:

With this letter, I am pleased to announce the weekend of May 20<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup>, 2017, the Sixth Sunday of Easter, as Diocesan Missions Sunday. This annual observance continues to be our way of supporting the apostolate of the Sisters of Saint Joseph in Brazil and the Sisters of Mercy in Chile.

The readings at Mass throughout the Easter season remind us of the great spirit of sharing as found in the early Church: “The community of believers were of one heart and mind.” (Acts 4: 32). Missionary activity is a living sign of our faith, which reaches beyond the local Church and assists our brothers and sisters in other places reminding us of the Church’s universality. “If God so loved us, we must also love one another.” (1 John 4:11).

In the pastoral statement of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops entitled: *To the Ends of the Earth: A Pastoral Statement on World Mission*, we read: “The Church, therefore, is missionary by her very nature. She continues the mission of the Son and the mission of the Holy Spirit by proclaiming to the ends of the earth the salvation Christ offers those who believe in Him. We are faithful to the nature of the Church to the degree that we love and sincerely promote her missionary activity. . . (2). Let His voice proclaim the Gospel through us as we bring the good news of salvation to the ends of the earth.” (75).

May we all be witnesses to the Gospel as we hear the words: “Go, therefore, and make disciples of all the nations...” (Matthew 28:19).
