Year of the Eucharist

If you look at this month's issue of the Catholic Courier you will find Bishop Matano's pastoral letter on the *Year of the Eucharist*. The Year of the Eucharist will coincide with the celebration of the Sesquicentennial of the Diocese of Rochester. According to the Bishop "It is my prayer and firm conviction that we make the Most Holy Eucharist, the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, the heart and center of our Sesquicentennial Celebration." The pastoral letter requires more than just a cursory reading. The bishop suggests that it be read, "in a reflective manner and in its entirety." While the letter is not very specific as to what to do, it does suggest that we continue to do what we do but by focusing on the Eucharist and how we approach it. There is a rubric change that the bishop asks that all parishes to implement. We will certainly follow the Bishop's wishes in the near future. I will write about this change at Mass in more depth soon.

Students from the graduating class of 2017 read some beautiful poems and verses from Scripture along with some wonderful musical selections. - Would you like adult focused time and a few moments where you don't have to worry about your little one/s?

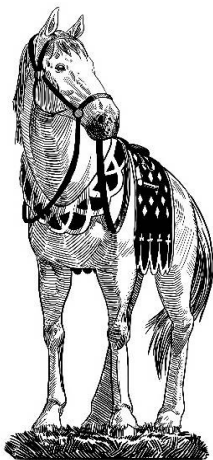

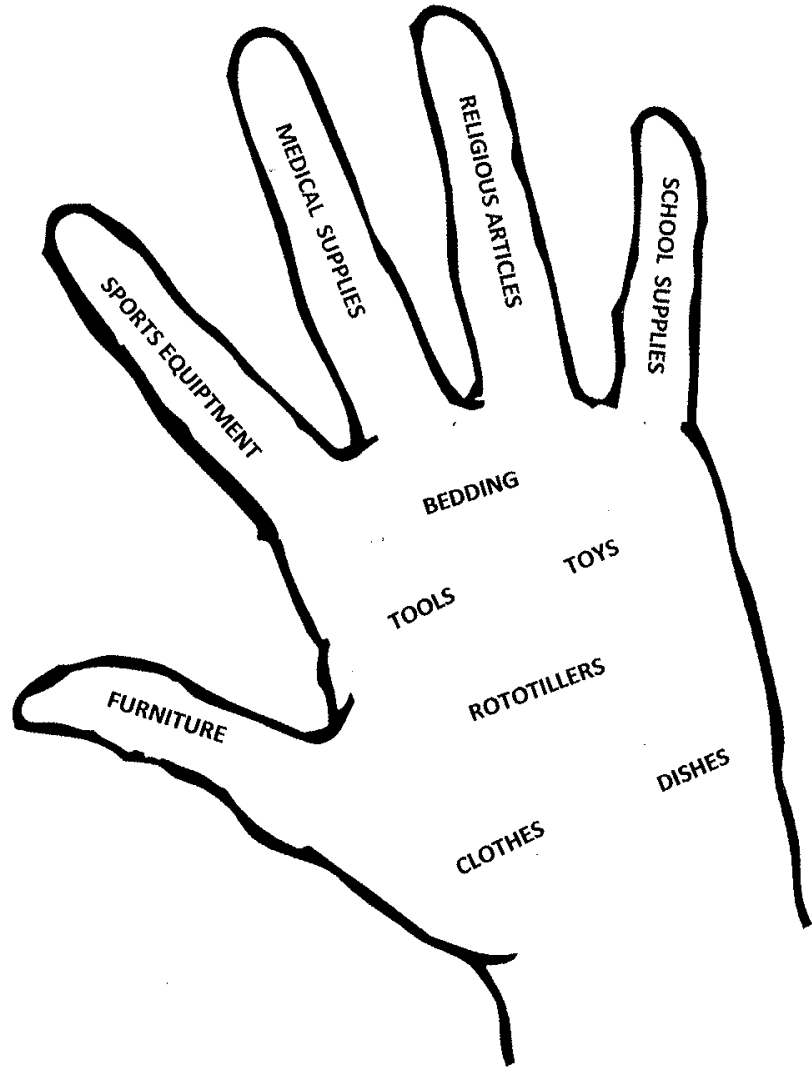
