Interesting Facts about the Nicaragua Project







Once a container leaves New York City, it takes about 2 weeks to arrive in Corinto, the port city located on the Pacific Ocean.

The container ship has to go through the Panama Canal since Nicaragua has only one port, Corinto.

The cost to send a container is \$5,000.

For export-import reasons, every box must be marked as to contents and be counted thus giving a sum of how many boxes are being shipped and how many of each category: how many clothes/shoes/ school supplies, etc.

There is a separate team of about six people in the town of Teustepe (Ann Marie's distribution center) who receive the containers and prepare the packets of goods for anyone who comes to receive them.

About 200 people a week get a packet of assorted items, and many items sent cannot be purchased in Nicaragua.

Any priest in the country(even those outside Ann Marie's diocese of Granada) who asks for goods for his people always receives what he feels is needed.
