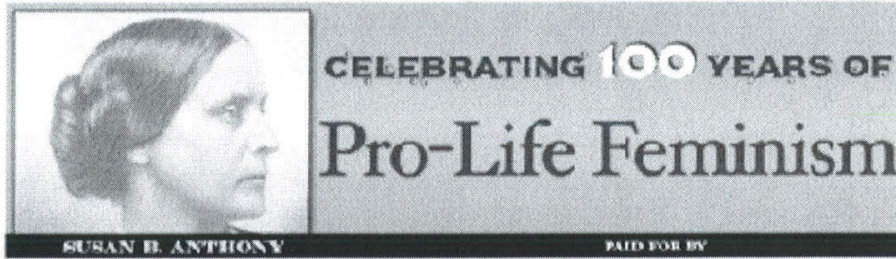
# BLESSING BOX UPDATE
