On Jan 24, 2018 Rev Paul Tomasso, vicar general of the Diocese of Rochester issued a letter to all Pastors and Pastoral Administrators in the Diocese regarding cautionary measures to be taken during the flu seasons. Starting this week we will be implementing those measures. Below is a list of the measures that we are urged to follow.

- Holy-water fonts are to be drained regularly and cleansed with a disinfecting soap. The old holy water should be disposed of in a sacrarium, or special sink.
  - Holy Communion may be given under the one species of the Sacred Host, without sharing a chalice containing the Blood of Christ. The General Instruction of the Roman Missal directs pastors to “instruct the Christian faithful that the Catholic faith teaches that Christ, whole and entire, and the true Sacrament, is received even under only one species, and hence that as regards the resulting fruits, those who receive under only one species are not deprived of any grace that is necessary for salvation.”
  - Those attending Mass are to use their best judgment regarding the sign of peace. They may offer it with a simple nod and bow of the head, saying “Peace be with you.” The appropriate response would be “And with your spirit.”
  - All vessels should be cleansed with hot water and mild soap following each Mass.
- The letter also encourages us to “... offer prayers for those afflicted by the Flu and for all health care workers as they care for the infirmed and monitor influenza activity in the Diocese of Rochester.”

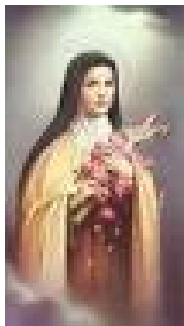

**Catholic Daughters will hold their next meeting on February 14 at Abigail's at 11:00 a.m. Since this will be Ash Wednesday, here are the guidelines from the Diocese of Rochester: Fast & Abstinence...**

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence. For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards. 1.) Members are asked to bring donations for CAP (can or

boxed food, TP, tissues, etc. 2.) Bingo will be at the Seneca Nursing Home on February 7 at 2:00 p.m. 3.)
