Lent has started and Easter is only a month away. There are many opportunities to enhance the Lenten experience in our parish. I would encourage everyone to take advantage of some of these opportunities. There are still Lenten meditation booklets at both churches that you are free to use. The meditations are short but meaningful. If all we do this lent is meditate on scripture daily then we have truly benefitted a great deal. Last Saturday's Holy Hour was led by the Knights of Columbus who did a great job. We have several opportunities each week for adoration. If all we do this lent is go to adoration each week then you have benefitted a great deal. On March 14th we will once again have the yearly Day of Penance and Mercy. While there are opportunities for confession on Saturday afternoons and First Fridays and First Saturdays and on Saturdays morning from 9-10 during lent, we will dedicate the day of March 14th for confessions from noon to 7pm. If all you do this lent is to take advantage of the sacrament of Penance then you will have benefitted greatly.

The weekly Stations of the Cross and the Holy Week services are always powerful and moving. For those who have never taken advantage of these devotions and services then you are missing out. I would certainly encourage you to attend some of the Holy Week services as they are very beneficial in enhancing the Lenten experience that leads to the joy of celebrating Easter

I have also been planning an ecumenical Good Friday service at St. Patrick's at noon. A number of the local churches will be participating. I will keep you posted.

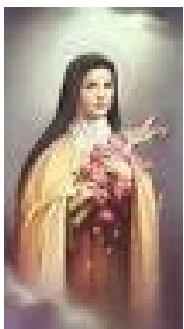
Parish Lenten Series
