


# The Mission of St. Francis & St. Clare Parish


Through Baptism we are called by God, rooted in Jesus Christ and guided by the Holy Spirit, to support and nurture a Catholic Christian Community:

# **Lenten Retreat**

# "The Spirituality of the Prayers at Mass"

This Thursday, Feb 29th at 6:30pm at the Ministry Center, will begin our Parish Lenten Retreat on "The Spirituality of the Prayers at Mass". There is a well know phrase that says, "lex orandi, lex credendi, lex vivendi," which basically means that, what we pray, is what we believe, is how we live our lives. Understanding what we pray is integrally related to what we believe. We all know the words of the prayers at Mass, and they have important meanings to us. I have found that learning, thinking and meditating on these words can draw us deeper into what we already feel. Some people say that they can pray just as well at home as they can in church or watch it online, therefore why should I go to Mass. This teaching about the Mass is intended to show the meaning and mystery behind the ritual celebration of prayer at Mass. We have our daily rituals or routines such as getting up in the morning and preparing for the day, we have our yearly rituals such as what we do on holidays. Ritual is essential in the Mass. It allows us to easily enter into the worship experience without needing to think about what we will say or do. Ritual gives us structure, security and familiarity as we come to God at Mass, so as to better focus on Him and all He has done, and less on ourselves. As Christians, we know that the important events of our faith have happened in time – in history. However, at the Mass, we pass over from history into mystery. This is to say that at Mass, we enter into the great work of salvation which God has accomplished. Our role in the ritual, then, is to actively participate through song, word and action. By doing so, the familiarity of the ritual and the action of the Mass enables us to enter into the mystery of God present to us. The first session will be on the Introductory Rites as well as the Liturgy of the Word.







# Stop the Legalization of Physician Assisted Suicide

# Let's Help People Live, Not Help Them Kill Themselves

For several years, we have been opposing legislation that would legalize physician-assisted suicide in New York State. A bill to this effect has again been introduced during the current legislative session. Several states have already passed similar measures, and there is grave concern that ours may follow.

As Catholics we believe in the sanctity of **every** human life, from the moment of conception to the moment of natural death. We believe that every person has inviolable, God-given dignity. No one should be helped, let alone encouraged, to purposefully end his or her life.

As we gear up to speak out against physician-assisted suicide (PAS), it's important to be clear on what PAS is and what it is NOT. PAS is not the same as allowing natural death to occur. For example:

- Choosing not to undergo another round of chemotherapy when faced with terminal cancer is not PAS.
- Administering narcotic pain medicine to a dying person with the intention of reducing her pain is not PAS.

PAS means a physician —who should be bound by the Hippocratic Oath to do no harm— is facilitating a person's death by providing the means and/or the information to enable that person to end her life.

PAS legislation is morally problematic in many ways. It endangers vulnerable elderly patients and people with disabilities who may be coerced into taking their own lives. It provides no counseling for patients with clinical depression whose mental illness may be driving them to this action. It flies in the face of society's suicide prevention efforts.


