The Mission of St. Francis & St. Clare Parish

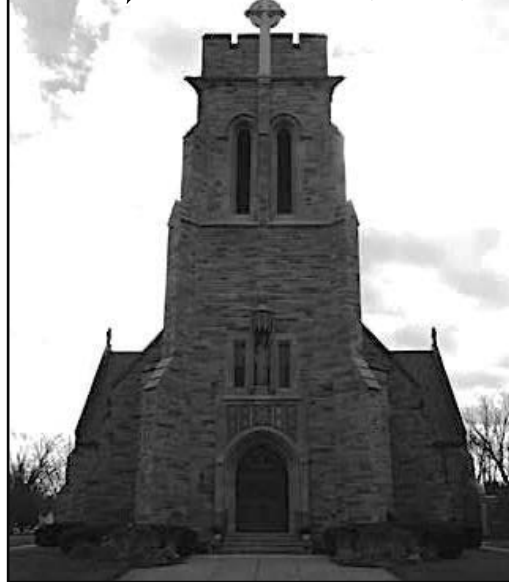
Through Baptism we are called by God, rooted in Jesus Christ and guided by the Holy Spirit, to support and nurture a Catholic Christian Community:

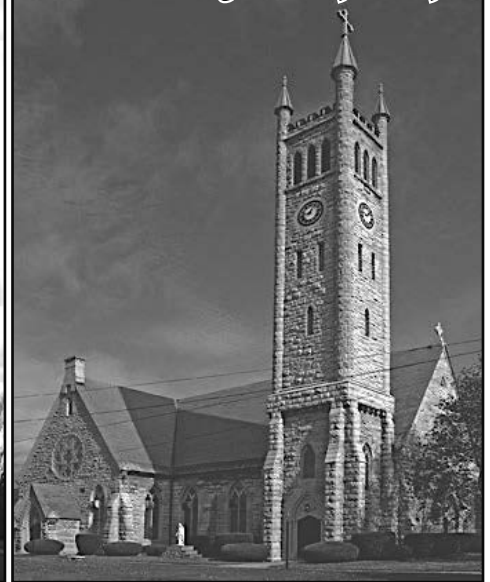

On the third, fourth and fifth Sundays of Lent we celebrate the Scrutinies when we have one or more people who are to be baptized at the Easter Vigil. Ben has been on the RCIA journey and is seeking baptism, therefore the First Scrutiny will take place this weekend at the 9:30 Mass.

The Scrutinies are described by the Church as:

“rites for self-searching and repentance, which are meant to uncover, then heal, all that is weak, defective, or sinful in the hearts of the elect; to bring out, then strengthen all that is upright, strong and good. The Scrutinies are celebrated in order to deliver the elect from the power of sin and Satan, to protect them against temptation, and to give them strength in Christ, who is the way, the truth and the life. These rites, therefore, should complete the conversion of the elect and deepen their resolve to hold fast to Christ and to carry out their decision to love God above all.”

Last Thursday was the first part of our Lenten Retreat. The second part will take place this Thursday at the Ministry Center where we will focus on the Liturgy of the Eucharist. The last part will conclude on the following Thursday and will focus on the final rites, music, evangelization and more.

What is the high point of your life?

Have you ever climbed a hill or mountain, and from the top, suddenly found perspective? Or perhaps you recall a particular experience that was a high point for you, a time after which life will never be the same. These summits or high points become a reference point for us. In those moments, our lives come into focus and our future direction is clearer, filled with greater hope and strength. The Eucharist is the summit of the Christian life. It is the high point from which we find direction and perspective. When we orient our lives with the Eucharist as the summit, the rest of our lives take shape. The Eucharist becomes our reference point from which our daily decisions and actions come into focus with Christ at the center of our lives. Perhaps we do not always think about this, but every Mass is an opportunity to encounter Jesus. We meet the Lord in the celebration of the Eucharist, and surely having done so, our lives will never be the same.

Are you ready?

We often speak of “going to Mass” like the way we go to a concert, movie, or theater performance. Even though we know that the Eucharist is not a performance, it may be hard to put into words what we do at the Mass. And as long as we think of ourselves as going to Mass, we limit the ways the Eucharist may shape us as disciples of Jesus Christ. Our role in the Eucharist is much more about participation than about watching. It’s like the difference between watching a sporting match and actually playing the game. We are called to full, conscious, and active participation in the Eucharist—we are to open our minds, hearts, and spirit, ready to be changed, to become more like Christ. When we truly participate in the Eucharist, we allow Christ to speak to us, be joined in sacrifice, and be nourished in Holy Communion. We are drawn to communion with Christ and each other. Through this encounter with the Lord, we are renewed. We do not simply go to Mass. We take part. And our participation changes us for the better

If you have one of these items to donate, call Anne Adler at the ministry center at 315-539-2944. Please leave a message if she is unavailable. **Please call by March 7th.**

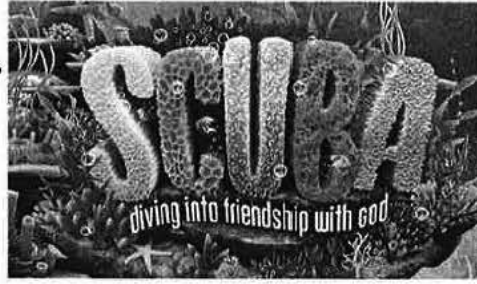
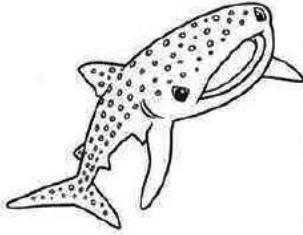
Father Roy thanks you in advance. A formal reception for him will be held later in the spring.

The new platform offers options for one-time gifts, pledges through recurring gifts charged to a credit/debit card, and Sustaining Gifts (recurring gifts that continue after the CMA campaign ends on May 31). You may choose to make your gift with a credit/debit card, through your bank account, or to have your pledge reminders mailed or emailed. Text Gifts: The new online giving platform offers a text-to-give option that seamlessly ties to our online giving page. Text gifts are an easy, quick, and safe way to make a gift to the CMA. **Text “GIVECMA” to (585) 502-9124 to donate from your phone or smart device.**

Credit/Debit Card: With our new online giving platform, the CMA is now able to accept American Express, as well as MasterCard, Visa, and Discover. For donors who are not comfortable with online giving, the pledge form may be used to send the required information by mail, or donors may call (585) 328-3210 ext. 1298 and speak with our Donor Relations Assistant.

Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT): You can now debit your gift directly from your checking or savings account using our online giving platform, or you may still include the information on your pledge card or pledge envelope.

Gifts by Check: Checks may be made payable to “Catholic Ministries Appeal (CMA)”. *Please do not mail cash in the pledge envelopes.*
