The Mission of St. Francis & St. Clare Parish

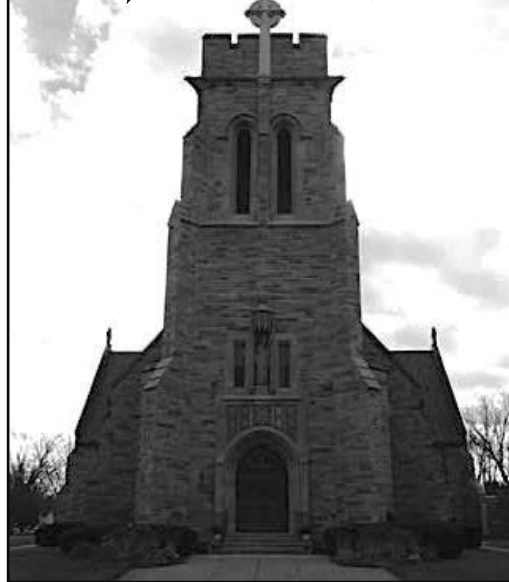
Through Baptism we are called by God, rooted in Jesus Christ and guided by the Holy Spirit, to support and nurture a Catholic Christian Community:

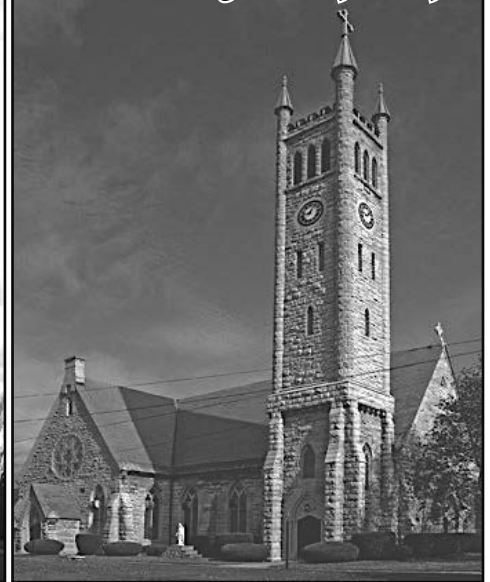

As we start the first Sunday of Lent, many Christians commit to fasting, as well as giving up certain luxuries in order to replicate the account of the sacrifice of Jesus Christ's journey into the desert for 40 days. We focus not only on sacrifice by giving up certain things but also by engaging in activities that are charitable and more spiritual. Our parish is continuing its participating in a program called FORMED.ORG. It is a free site that livestreams Catholic videos and movies. If you go to FORMED.ORG you can sign up as a member of the parish, for a daily Lenten reflection that can be sent to your computer or smart phone for those who have access to such devices. There is an advertisement in each of our churches entitled AMEN which is another source for daily meditations, especially during Lent.

Please continue to check out our literature racks in church for information on the eucharist and various prayer types, including litanies and chaplets as well as Lenten reflections.

Parish Lenten Retreat will be Thursdays, Feb 20, March 1, and March 14 at 6:30pm until 8:00pm with a soup supper at 6:00pm. I have entitled the retreat "The Spirituality of the Prayers at Mass." I had done a teaching mass with the confirmation class a couple of years ago and truly enjoyed speaking about the Mass. It also seemed well accepted by the students. I decided to break that Teaching Mass into three sections, but to have it be more than just a teaching lecture, but a chance for you to combine teaching with your own spirituality experience to be drawn even deeper into the meaning of the Mass. You can sit and listen or choose to participate in a discussion. It is up to you, but I promise that it will be interesting.

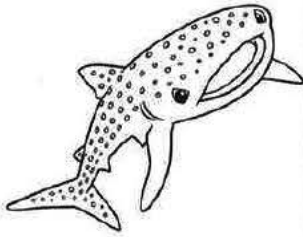

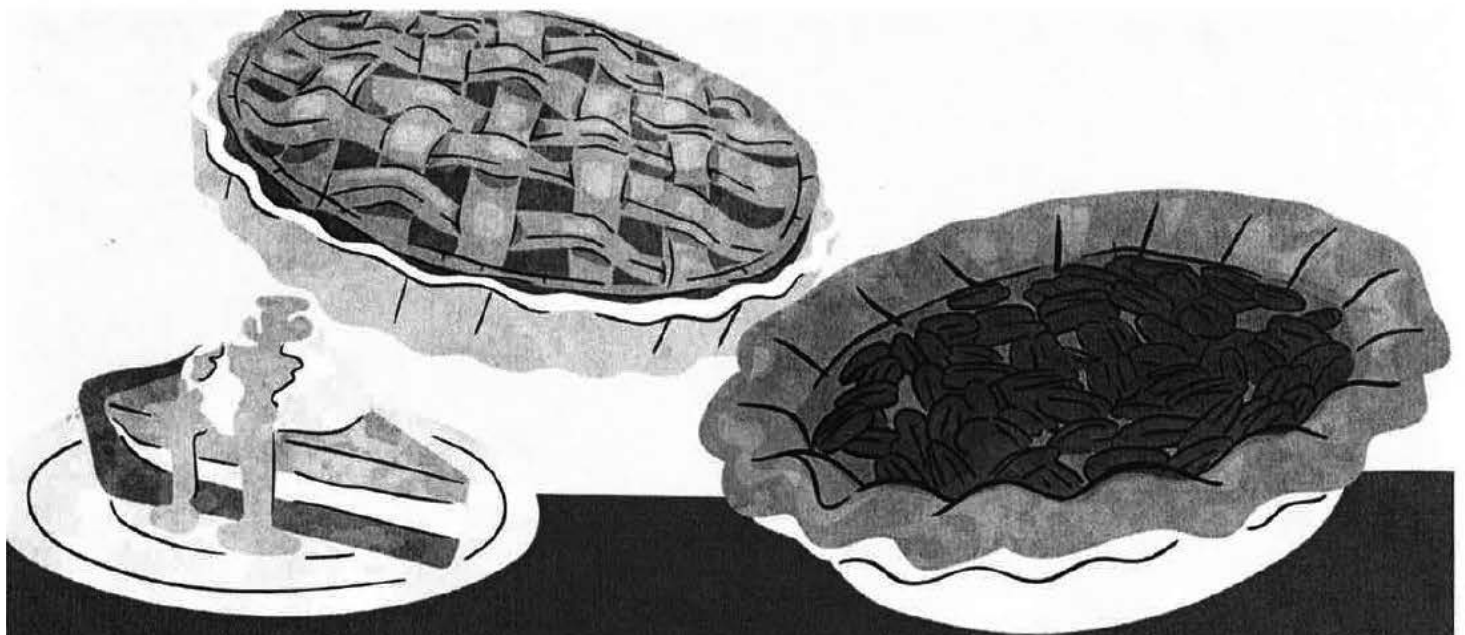
