The annual Priest Convocation, a gathering of priests from around the Diocese of Rochester, will take place this Monday April 8, Tuesday April 9 and Wednesday April 10 in Corning, NY. There will be Communion Services on those days at St. Mary's. This meeting gives the priests of the Diocese an opportunity to meet with Bishop Matano and discuss pastoral issues and to focus on priestly formation.

Penitential Rite

At the Lenten retreat on the "Spirituality of the Prayers at Mass", I remember speaking about the Penitential Rite and the prayer called the Confetior. It is a prayer in which we seek mercy before we continue with the celebration of Mass. There are several options in the Roman Missal for this prayer of mercy. The first option is to recite the Confetior followed by the Kyrie, (Lord have mercy, Christ have mercy, Lord have mercy). We currently use one of the other options. After praying about the Confetior and explaining the depths of its meaning at the retreat, I have decided to use the first option, the Confiteor from now on. I will share with you, at a later date, some reflections on the Confetior that were discussed at the retreat. Next weekend, be prepared to recite the following prayer: I confess to almighty God and to you my brothers and sisters that I have failed to do, through my fault, through my fault, through my most grievous fault. Therefore, I ask Blessed Mary—ever virgin—all the angels and saints, and you, my brothers and sisters, to pray for me to the Lord our God.

Divine Mercy

Much has been written about mercy, in particular, Divine Mercy. However, I don't know that mercy is that difficult a concept to truly understand. Mercy is something that we all have personal experience with, either by showing mercy to someone or by receiving mercy from someone else. But mercy between human beings can have its limits, whereas God's mercy is absolutely unending. It is this never-ending love and mercy that we pray about so often. Please join us this afternoon for a celebration of Divine Mercy.

Next week we plan to start having the ushers take up the collection at St. Patrick's. We are working on organizing the ushers at St. Mary's to do the same in the near future.
