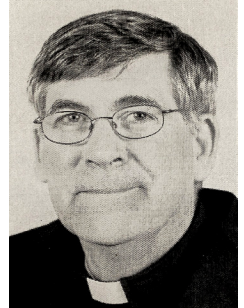

- This calls us to social justice to service those in need and to work together for God and one another



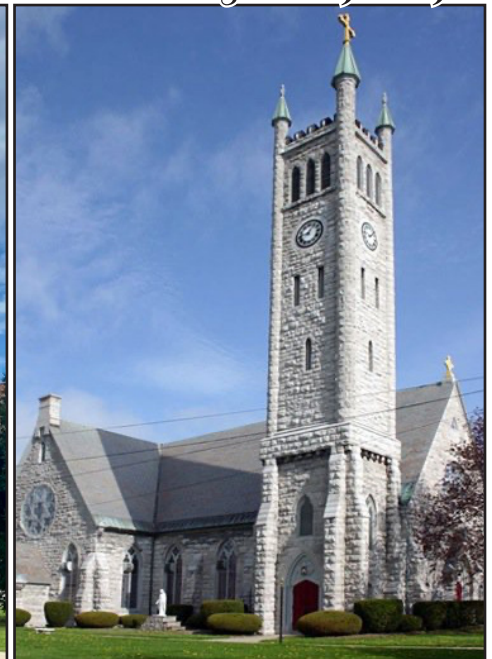

A week ago, this Saturday the annual Antonio Varacalli Award was given to Paula Coffey for her dedication to the community. The award has been given out for a number of years, and I have attended all of them. Antonio was quite the famous hero in this town, and the award is given to those who continue that tradition of heroism in many ways throughout the community. Every year I am amazed at what people in the community do for others. I see it in our church community and in the wider community. We each have our own God-given gifts and talents, and it is up to each one of us to use them to the best of our abilities in helping others. As well as the Antonio Varacalli award, additional recognition went to "Community Angels," given to members of local organizations and charities nominated by their respective organizations. Students at Elizabeth Cady Stanton School were asked to write essays on the theme of "How have you, or how might you, be a good citizen by making a difference in someone's life." There were 4th and 5th grade students who won. Their essays are online. I was very pleased at what they wrote about heroes, hopefully this event will help them to follow the heroic tradition.

Earth Day 2024

The first Earth Day was held in 1970 to help people become more aware of the need to protect the environment. Over the years many different issues have been addressed. This year the theme for Earth Day is "Planet vs. Plastics" as an attempt to show the negative issues that can come from the use of plastics and the need for stricter controls to help keep us and the environment safe. In 2001 the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops came out with a statement on the environment entitled "*Global Climate Change: A Plea for Dialogue, Prudence and the Common Good*" in which the first paragraph states, "As people of faith, we are convinced that 'the earth is the Lord's and all it holds' (Ps 24:1). Our Creator has given us the gift of creation: the air we breathe, the water that sustains life, the fruits of the land that nourish us, and the entire web of life without which human life cannot flourish. All of this God created and found 'very good.' We believe our response to global climate change should be a sign of our respect for God's creation."

In 2006, to address growing ecological awareness and the need to implement Catholic social teaching on ecology within the US Church, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) helped form the Catholic Climate Covenant. This group continues in 2024 with a program called "*Healing Our Throwaway Culture: A Focus on Plastics*," sharing a similar theme with the secular world. It is very informative.

Gloria

The words in bold type are the words of the Gloria.

The words in regular type are an explanation of what that phrase of the Gloria means.

The questions in italics are an opportunity to reflect on the words of the Gloria and to associate them with the experiences in your life so that when reciting or singing the Gloria, the words will have more meaning to you.

**Glory to God in the highest,
and on earth peace to people of good will.**

Having asked for God's forgiveness, now we praise Him for His goodness. The first line of this ancient hymn of praise, echoes the song of the angels at Bethlehem proclaiming Jesus' birth. In the story of Elizabeth and Zechariah, the Annunciation and the Prophecy of Simeon, humans praise God. The Gloria is sung by angels, proclaiming the birth of Christ. The whole bible is a story of Salvation History. In God's greatness the Divine becomes flesh and dwells among us to bring Salvation to the world. Therefore, we give glory to God.

1. *How has the birth of someone you know changed your life?*
2. *How has the birth of Christ change your life?*

We praise you,

Praising God is focused entirely on the expression of wonder and awe at who God is and what God has done.

1. *What attribute of God has the most meaning for you?*

we bless you,

To "Bless God" is used numerous times in the Bible especially in the Old Testament. Through blessing God, we lift God up for proper worship. It is proper to worship God, the Creator of all.

1. *What part or aspect of Creation means the most to you?*

we adore you,

We adore God because of what God did through the Son which He adores, and that is Jesus Christ who came to give His life as a ransom for those who would trust in Him (Mark 10:45). To "adore" is to worship and respect someone for what they have done. God has given us creation, free will and salvation.

1. *What role does salvation take in my life?*

we glorify you,

The verb glorify means “to give weight to” or “to honor.” Thus, to glorify God is to recognize God for who He really is and to respond appropriately.

1. *Who is God to me?*

**we give you thanks for your great glory,
Lord God, heavenly King,
O God, almighty Father.**

We have just given reasons for God’s greatness and our need to worship God. We now give titles to that God, “King” and “Father.”

1. *What does calling God “King” or “Father” mean to me?*

**Lord Jesus Christ, Only Begotten Son,
Lord God, Lamb of God, Son of the Father,
you take away the sins of the world,
have mercy on us;
you take away the sins of the world,
receive our prayer;
you are seated at the right hand of the Father,
have mercy on us.**

We now glorify Jesus who is called, “Lamb of God”, a title that comes from the sacrifice of a lamb at the Passover in Exodus that led to freedom, and now signifies the sacrifice of Jesus for our freedom from sin.

1. *What role does forgiveness play in my life?*

**For you alone are the Holy One,
you alone are the Lord,
you alone are the Most High,
Jesus Christ,
with the Holy Spirit,
in the glory of God the Father.**

At the end of this beautiful hymn, we acknowledge our God as a Trinity of Persons, an amazing mystery of unity and relationship that is all about love and peace.

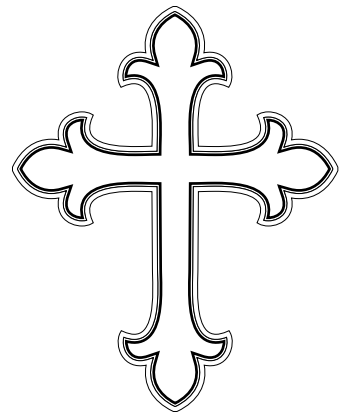
