

On Thursday, 14 of our young men and women received the sacrament of Confirmation from Bishop Matano at St. Mary's in Canandaigua. It has been a two-year process for these young people, which doesn't end with Confirmation but is a lifelong process of being open to the Holy Spirit and following Jesus the Good Shepherd.

There are five 5 men who will start the seminary process this fall for the Diocese of Rochester. Please pray that they also will be open to the Holy Spirit as they discern their call.

Next weekend we will be celebrating a May Crowning at each of our Churches, one at 5:00pm at St. Mary's and another at 11:00am at St. Patrick's. This is always a beautiful ceremony involving our youth and faith in the Blessed Virgin Mary. Next weekend will start First Communions, always a blessed event. At each of our Masses next weekend we will be celebrating First Communions. I always find this a glorious experience, welcoming children into sharing the Body of Christ with us for the first time. It warms might heart and brings joy to my soul.

Planning for Corpus Christi Sunday, June 2 is ongoing. It may sound a little early for that but it is going to be a powerful celebration. As a prelude to it we will be praying the Corpus Christi Novena. The Eucharistic Procession is also being planned. Another event that is being planned is part of the National Eucharistic Revival initiative entitled, "Invite One," a program for all of us to participate in by inviting someone back to church who has either not been with us in a while, or may never have attended Mass. The literature is forthcoming.



# Justice. Peace and Life

"Throwing away plastic in the sea is criminal. This kills biodiversity, the Earth, everything." -Pope Francis, TV interview

...so let's treat God's Creation as a garden we are called to tend,

Not as an apartment we can trash like bad tenants who didn't leave a security deposit.

## POISONING GOD'S CREATION WITH PLASTIC

In commemoration of Earth Day this month, the Catholic Climate Covenant and the ecumenical group Creation Justice Ministries, among other organizations, are highlighting the environmental disasters caused by plastic.

Tons of plastic pollution end up in waterways, killing off wildlife, including birds, fish and whales who mistakenly consume it and are also strangled by it.

Plastic breaks down into small flecks, called microplastics, which are showing up in our food supply, and therefore in us. Recent studies have found microplastics in the placentas of newborn babies. The chemicals in these plastics have been linked to a variety of adverse health conditions including reproductive harm and developmental delays in children.

It's also important to remember that most plastic is derived from oil and natural gas, and that extracting and refining these fossil fuels have their own adverse effects on the environment. Plastics can take hundreds of years to degrade, so they are filling up landfills. They never disappear, but as they break into those smaller and smaller parts, they release methane, one of the most lethal greenhouse gasses, contributing significantly to climate change.

Member countries of the U.N are currently negotiating a first-ever treaty on plastic pollution. Countries of the Global South and island nations are disproportionately harmed by plastic pollution. We're called to stand in solidarity with them. Join with the Catholic Climate Covenant in insisting that U.S. negotiators ensure a strong and enforceable treaty. Replace single-use plastics with reusable shopping bags, cutlery, cups, straws, and water bottles.

Use bar soap instead of liquid soap.

Try bar shampoo and conditioner and laundry detergent sheets


