We receive the Holy Spirit at Baptism and we are strengthened by the Holy Spirit in the Sacrament of Confirmation. In the celebration of Confirmation, the laying on of hands and the anointing with Chrism is the sign of God's grace. In Confirmation, the Holy Spirit draws us into fuller participation in the Church, opening our hearts to God's Word.

Jesus' Family Tree Although there are more than twenty genealogies in the Old Testament, only two appear in the New Testament. In the genealogies of Jesus, Matthew and Luke both include David, the shepherd boy who became a great king of Israel. Also appearing on both lists is Abraham, a Patriarch of the nation of Israel. While Matthew stops with Abraham, Luke traces Jesus' ancestry all the way back to Adam. In Mark 3:31–35, Jesus talks about who is part of his family.



You were baptized into the Church. The Church supports you, leads you, teaches you the faith, encourages you, and provides you with the opportunity to grow as a Catholic. The Church helps you recognize the gifts God has given you. Your gifts should be shared with others. You can

use your talents and gifts to serve your family, parish, and local community. Serving others is an important part of being a Christian. In Confirmation, Catholics are invited to give more of themselves to their faith and to use their gifts in more responsible and challenging ways.

Worship The Rite of Confirmation

The Holy Spirit inspires us and gives us the grace to love and serve others. The gift of the Holy Spirit is given to us in the Sacrament of Baptism and then sealed, or strengthened, in **Confirmation**. In the Rite of Confirmation, the bishop prays that we will use the Gifts of the Holy Spirit to follow Christ more closely. When Confirmation is celebrated during Mass, the bishop may give a homily similar to the following. The homily explains the Scripture readings and helps the Confirmation **candidates** gain deeper insight into the Sacrament they are receiving.

On the day of Pentecost the apostles received the Holy Spirit as the Lord had promised. They also received the power of giving the Holy Spirit to others and so completing the work of baptism. This we read in the Acts of the Apostles. When Saint Paul placed his hands on those who had been baptized, the Holy Spirit came upon them, and they began to speak in other languages and in prophetic words.


Bishops are successors of the apostles and have this power of giving the Holy Spirit to the baptized, either personally or through the priests they appoint. in one faith but in different vocations, and works within us to make the Church one and holy.

The gift of the Holy Spirit which you are to receive will be a spiritual sign and seal to make you more like Christ and more perfect members of his Church. At his baptism by John, Christ himself was anointed by the Spirit and sent out on his public ministry to set the world on fire.

You have already been baptized into Christ and now you will receive the power of his Spirit and the sign of the cross on your forehead. You must be witnesses before all the world to his suffering, death, and resurrection; your way of life should at all times reflect the goodness of Christ. Christ gives varied gifts to his Church, and the Spirit distributes them among the members of Christ's body to build up the holy people of God in unity and love.

Be active members of the Church, alive in Jesus Christ. Under the guidance of the Holy Spirit give your lives completely in the service of all, as did Christ, who came not to be served but to serve.

Rite of Confirmation



Confirmed in the Spirit

Confirmation strengthens the graces of Baptism. Confirmation celebrates the Holy Spirit's presence in the Church and action in our lives. We relive the Pentecost experience and grow stronger in our faith so that we can do God's work in the Church.

The readings proclaimed during the celebration of Confirmation are usually ones that have been specifically chosen by the Church for use when the Church is welcoming candidates for Confirmation. After the readings, the candidates may be identified by the bishop. A homily similar to the one you just read is then given to emphasize the meaning of the Sacrament. Next, the candidates renew their baptismal promises. The candidates are then invited forward, usually with a sponsor, and the bishop extends his hands over them, signifying the sending of the Holy Spirit upon the faithful. enabling them to carry out the mission of the Church. Then, the bishop places his hand on each candidate and anoints the candidate's forehead. praying, "(Name) be sealed with the Gift of the Holy Spirit." This action signifies the giving of the strength of the Holy Spirit, who guides us in carrying out our responsibilities as members of the Church.

The Mass then continues with the general intercessions and the Liturgy of the Eucharist. The Mass ends with a special blessing for those confirmed.

Like the Sacraments of Baptism and Holy Orders, the Sacrament of Confirmation can be received only once. The "mark of Christ" that we receive in Confirmation remains with us forever. It leads us to a life of worship and service to the Church under God's constant care.

The Action of the Holy Spirit in Our Lives

The Church identifies seven particular Gifts of the Holy Spirit received in Baptism and strengthened in Confirmation. These gifts strengthen us in Christ's love and inspire us to spread his truth to others. These traditional gifts are wisdom, understanding, knowledge, right judgment, courage, reverence, and wonder and awe.

Wisdom helps us know how God wants us to live. Understanding helps us know what God

teaches through Jesus, the Bible, and the Church. Knowledge helps us know and appreciate that God is more important than anything else in life. Right judgment helps us make good decisions in our everyday lives. Courage helps us be strong in living our faith in Christ. Reverence helps us love God more than anything else. Wonder and awe help us to be thankful for all God's gifts. The Gifts of the Holy Spirit strengthen us to give witness to Jesus, who suffered, died, and rose again for our Salvation. This is the good news the Holy Spirit helps us proclaim to others. This truth is essential to our Catholic faith, which is one and the same throughout the world.

Confirmation Confirmation is a Sacrament of Christian Initiation in which we receive the special strength of the Holy Spirit to faithfully give witness to Christ and grow in holiness.

Gifts of the Holy Spirit The Gifts of the Holy Spirit are the seven special gifts, or blessings, that enable us to become more Christlike: wisdom, understanding, knowledge, right judgment, courage, reverence, and wonder and awe.

witness Witness is an attesting to the truth of something by words or actions. We give witness to Christ by imitating in our everyday lives what Jesus would say or do.


Scripture Children of God

This Scripture passage comes from Paul's letter to the early Church in Rome. It is one of the readings often proclaimed during the Confirmation liturgy. In it, Paul encourages the Church by saying that the Holy Spirit unites believers with Christ and with God.

For those who are led by the Spirit of God are children of God. For you did not receive a spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you received a spirit of adoption, through which we cry, "Abba, Father!" The Spirit itself bears witness with our spirit that we are children of God, and if children, then heirs, heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ, if only we suffer with him so that we may also be glorified with him.

Romans 8:14-17

The Holy Spirit dwells within us, and we are adopted children of God the Father. As children of God, we need never fear. We can be confident that God is with us always. Inspired by that confidence, we can give witness to our faith by following Jesus' example.



Our Church Teaches

We receive the Holy Spirit in a special way in the Sacrament of Confirmation. Through Confirmation

our relationship with the Church deepens and we are called to spread and defend the faith by word and deed with greater commitment. The Holy Spirit strengthens us to give witness to the Church's mission.

The Holy Spirit has a special role in the Liturgy of the Church. The Holy Spirit unites us in faith and prepares the Church to be in the We Believe

In the Sacrament of Confirmation, the Holy Spirit unites us more perfectly to Christ and to the Church.


presence of Christ. In the Liturgy of the Word, the Holy Spirit recalls the words and deeds of

Christ. Then, by the power of the Holy Spirit and the word of the priest, the bread and wine are changed into the Body and Blood of Christ. The Holy Spirit also transforms us into Christ's Body so that we can live as Christ lived. Both Baptism and Confirmation leave a permanent spiritual mark on our souls.

Inspired to Serve
