- This calls us to social justice to service those in need and to work together for God and one another



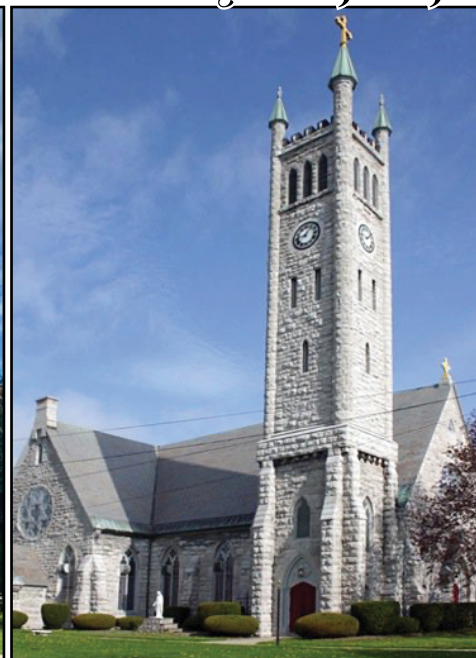

Dear Parishioners of Saint Francis and Saint Clare's Parish,

Happy Divine Mercy Sunday! Today is such a beautiful and special feast. Celebrating Divine Mercy Sunday reminds us of God's unending love for us. He will forgive us again and again, no matter how many times we fall down. As I have read through Saint Faustina's diary, in which she writes of the Divine Mercy apparitions, there have been many quotes which I found very moving. I'm going to share a couple of my favorites with you. "Faithfulness to one grace draws others." This was definitely one of my favorites because it is so encouraging. If we accept the graces Jesus is offering us, He will give us even more. Of course, a spiritual grace does not mean material success, but rather growth in our faith. Saint Faustina talked about how many graces God wants to pour out on the world. However, she says that there are many people who do not want to accept them. Sometimes, we do not want to accept God's help because we think that we are strong enough on our own. In reality, it is impossible to go through life alone and be happy. We need God's forgiveness so that we can get back on the right track. We need the forgiveness and love of our friends and family. We need God to be there. We need Him to be the undying peace in our hearts. But, we can't have that peace and knowledge that we are eternally forgiven if we don't accept God's graces. As Catholics, we are blessed with the Sacrament of Confession. We can go whenever we need to and receive forgiveness for our sins. You can go as often as you want. I assure you, going to confession regularly keeps those graces coming. I have found that if I confess something and set my mind to not doing it again, after a few tries, I begin to get better. Jesus will give you the grace to overcome even the worst of sin. You must have true contrition and keep working at it. Jesus loves us so much and He wants us to come to Heaven with Him. Our goal should always be to get there. Nothing is too far for His love to reach. All we have to do is be open to the graces He's offering us, and the others will come flying in. Before I wrap this up, I'd like to share a very powerful prayer with you. This is also from the diary of Saint Faustina.

"I do not fear anything, although the storm is raging, and frightful bolts strike all around me, and then I feel quite alone. Yet, my heart senses You, and my trust grows, and I see all Your omnipotence which upholds me. With You, Jesus, I go through life, amid storms and rainbows, with a cry of joy, singing the song of Your mercy. I will not stop singing my song of love until the choir of Angels picks it up. There is no power that can stop me in my flight toward God."

Isn't that beautiful? I think sometimes we all need to hear that. "There is no power that can stop me in my flight toward God." I hope you have a fruitful Divine Mercy Sunday and enjoy your Easter season!

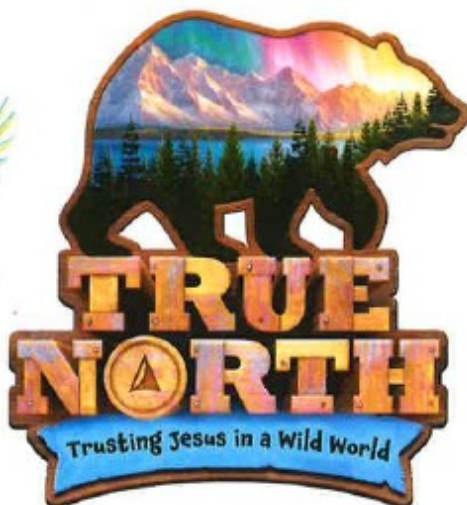
