



My Vocation Story

Like any regular Sunday Catholic, I attend mass regularly. I was raised this way and have been involved with the Church in a variety of ways since fourth grade.

My story doesn't have this thundering voice from above or fireworks or any Hollywood style backdrop. My vocation story actually begins in silence.

Like many Catholics, the one sacrament that I dreaded was the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Sitting down with a priest and confessing your sins, wondering if now you're labeled "that person." One weekend, while sitting in church waiting for mass to begin, my eyes kept moving toward the confessional. Something inside me said, "Go for it." So, I did. The next Saturday, during the time for Reconciliation, I went in. To my joy, I found the confessionals aren't face to face, but behind the screen. "Great, they don't have to look at me!" During the sacrament of confession, I went through the ritual and the priest (an older priest who helps out) gave me counsel and absolution. It was during the absolution, the part that goes..." through the ministry of the Church may God grant you pardon and peace and I absolve you of your sins;" I absolve you—those words right there—sent a feeling of complete peace throughout my body. I could literally feel the sins being taken away.

During my penitential prayer afterward, in the silence of this great Cathedral, I heard the voice of God finally getting through. I heard Him say, "This is what I want you to do." It was the sins I was carrying that were blocking my heart from fully hearing the voice of God.

From that point on, other signs came to light. My brother John, who left the Church many years ago for personal reasons, called me one day and told me that he had a dream about me. I asked him what it was about, and he replied that he had a dream about my ordination. Out of the blue, this person who doesn't attend Catholic Church, had a dream about attending my ordination. Another sign that occurred to me was the pew I sat in during mass. I befriended an elderly woman at mass and I would sit with her weekly. To this day, I never knew her name or what became of her. One day I was sitting in the pew and I looked up at the archway above my seat (each archway has a scripture carving) and the carving read, "You are a priest forever."

Of course, there have been people hinting for years that I would make a good priest and since people now know the direction I am heading, they are beyond thrilled for me.

So, this is where my story begins; in the silence of a majestic Cathedral during the sacrament of Reconciliation. This is going to be a wonderful journey that I am happy to share with you along with way.

My prayers are always with you and ask that you continue to pray for me.

### MISSION APPEAL AUGUST 9-10

From the Preacher of MCP: For the Diocese of Ngong, Kenya 2025

The theme for this year's mission cooperation plan is to help with the facilitation of the ongoing training of the Catechists, who number 919, both volunteers and those who work full time. With your contribution, next year the diocese of Ngong will conduct seminars for the catechists and will help purchase motorcycles and bicycles for those who come from areas with no roads and non-paved roads. The price of a motorcycle is about \$2,000 and a bicycle is approximately \$120. You will be fulfilling the mission of Jesus Christ, when he asked his own disciples to go out into the whole world and baptize them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Through your help, evangelization will continue, and baptisms will continue in my home diocese. Thank you, God bless you and your families in your generosity.








### The Violinist
