

St. John Vianney and the Seminarian Picnic

Last Monday was the Feast of St. John Vianney, the patron saint of priests. He has an interesting story in that he grew up in a time when the Catholic Church was persecuted and one had to travel in secret to attend a Mass. From what I've read, John Vianney made his First Communion in someone's kitchen in secret so the family would not be persecuted. Seeing how priests were so dedicated to their vocation, John Vianney wanted to become a priest. Because of the societal upheaval at the time, he was lacking in education and was almost not allowed to be ordained. His piety overshadowed his lack of education and ended up becoming well known as a priest and Confessor. People came from all over to confession with him, sometimes he was in the confessional for more than 12 hours a day. When I was at Beckett Hall (a house of discernment in Rochester) there was a shrine with a statue of St. John Vianney in the backyard. I had to walk by it everyday in order to get to my car. When I first saw the statue, I noticed that John Vianney's nose had been broken off. The more I walked by the statue, the more I realized that a person doesn't have to be perfect to answer a call to a vocation, whatever it may be; one just needs to answer the call with a heart of love.

Last Monday, there was a picnic for seminarians of the Diocese of Rochester at St. Dominic's in Shortsville which I attended with Deacon David. It was put on by a homeschool organization. We started with a lovely Mass at St. Dominic's that was well attended by the current seminarians and many parishioners, then followed by a wonderful picnic. It was good to meet the seminarians of the diocese, they come from many different parishes and are at different stages of seminary formation.

Meditative Prayer

This form of prayer is active mental prayer. What does that mean? It is called active because we intentionally consider a text or an image as to enter prayer. We then allow our mind and imagination to ponder the text or image. In a real sense, meditative prayer enables us to use the truth and beauty of God that we find in Sacred Scripture, the writings of the saints, the art of icons and statues, God's work in creation, and the exquisite architecture of an amazing church as we allow ourselves to be moved to elevate our mind and heart to God.

Think of a favorite Gospel passage, a prayer composed by a saint, a statue in your home parish, a sunrise or sunset, a newborn child's tiny body, or our Cathedral of St. Paul here in Pittsburgh. As you reflect on each, listen carefully to what God is speaking to your heart. St. Padre Pio spoke of why we should meditate. "The final purpose of meditation is the love of God and one's neighbor. Love the first with all your soul and without reservation, love the second as another self, and you will have arrived at the final purpose of meditation."


