Pathway Home

Pathway Home is a Comfort Care Home that is located on 1529 Mound Road in Seneca Falls. A Comfort Care Home differs from a Hospice House in that at a comfort care home we care for one or two people at a time with the help of trained volunteers and staff, providing care at no cost to the resident or their family. A hospice program supports the care with nursing and social work. Each Comfort Care Home acts independently, choosing patients based on its own assessment of who has the greatest need of their help. Pathway Home is a home where the staff and volunteers become the resident's "extended family," and provide 24-hour care, seven days a week. Residents of Pathway receive hospice service from Rochester Regional Health Home Care and Hospice. I have been very impressed with the kind work that is done at Pathway. To get a better idea of what goes on at the Pathway Home, I urge to go to the website and checkout the video that the Duprey's created. I joined the Board of Directors a couple of years ago and have become more aware of how the Home works. Pathway Home is a tax-exempt, not-for-profit organization. The services provided to residents and their families cost approximately \$200 per day, per resident. Pathway does not receive any insurance payments. We rely on donations and volunteers. Pathway has a number of fundraisers throughout the year: the Butterfly Release, Pot of Gold dinner and, coming very soon, the Fall Gala.

Pathway's annual dinner this year will be a "Night at the Disco" that will give you a chance to relive the 1970s, or maybe just enjoy a good dinner at the Lux Hotel and Conference Center on Mound Road in Waterloo. It will take place on Saturday September 20, 2025 at 6:00pm.

Tickets are now on sale for the event for \$65 each. Table sponsorships also are available, as are opportunities to donate to a silent auction and basket raffles. Still not sure how to help? 

New Study: 1 in 10 Abortion Drug Users Suffer Serious Complications

"Contrary to the FDA's assurances that mifepristone is safe, a new study finds that nearly 11 percent of women suffer serious complications after taking it." (Atkinson, 2025). A recent study by the Ethics and Public Policy Center (EPPC) analyzed health insurance claims data for over 865,000 medication abortions using mifepristone between 2017 and 2023. This study reported a serious adverse event rate of nearly 11%, which is significantly higher than the rate of less than 0.5% reported in the FDA's drug label based on earlier clinical trials. The study found that 10.93% of women who used mifepristone experienced serious adverse events within 45 days, including sepsis, infection, hemorrhaging, and other complications.

The Family Hope Center works to save the lives of the unborn and to help keep all women safe by providing information about life-affirming options, while sharing the truth and love of Jesus Christ.
