



St. Francis and St. Clare Parish 2024-2025 Fiscal Report

Our fiscal year ended on June 30, 2025. In this bulletin, there is a summary and graph showing what income we received, as well as the expenses. To put it in simple terms-we did well this past fiscal year. Our regular collections were up almost 8%, which is fantastic. I can't thank you enough for all your support. Most of the other income sources went up as well, leaving us with a total operating income of \$811,910 which is a 7% increase over last year. But then there were the expenses that went up about 5%. The net operating income for the parish, which is a good indicator of the parish's financial health, was up just over 8%.

In addition to the net operating income, we also have sources of income and expenses that are not part of the regular day to day operation of the parish. These income and expenses are referred as non-operating. The non-operating income was from the increase in our investments, as well as a very large donation of \$100,000 from John Rogers in memory of his mother and sister. The non-operating expenses came from capital projects, as well as the Catholic Ministries shortfall. This past year, our CMA goal of \$82,000 is an amount that the parish must pay regardless of how much is given to the campaign. Fortunately, this year the parishioners gave generously to the Catholic Ministries Appeal which brought us to 85% of our goal. This is the best that we have ever done. Next year, I expect that we will do even better. We have always been at the bottom of the list of parishes that have contributed to the CMA, but we are starting to climb. It is good to know that we are doing our part to continue to help ourselves, the diocese, as well as Catholic Charities and many other groups that help the needy. The CMA money also goes toward helping with vocations, especially to the priesthood. The diocese currently has 10 men in Formation. I met most of them a couple of weeks ago, including Deaon David Cataline who will be ordained to the priesthood in June of 2026. I believe that they will all make fine priests for our diocese. THANK YOU for continuing to support our parish.

Dear Parishioners of Saint Francis and Saint Clare Parish,

Over the past several months I've received requests for a bulletin article on hope because this is the Jubilee Year of Hope. I've broken my discussion into several parts that will be in the bulletin until we reach the end of this paper.

So, let's start with the basics. What is a Jubilee Year? Every 25 years, the Church sets aside a year for us to focus deeper on growing in our faith. It is a time to forgive, grow in virtue, take pilgrimages, grow closer to God, and rediscover our faith. It is like a Sabbath year. Each jubilee year, the pope will give the year a certain theme. This year is the Jubilee Year of Hope. What is the Catholic definition of hope? It goes deeper than hoping you'll win your next game, pass a test, or get a pay raise. That's optimism. According to the Baltimore Catechism, hope disposes us to trust that God, because of His power, mercy, and fidelity, will give us eternal happiness and the means to obtain it. So, in other words, hope is a virtue that helps us trust that God has everything under control. The opposite of hope is despair, which is the refusal to trust that God will give us the necessary help for the salvation of our soul. So this year, we're called to grow in the virtue of hope, which means trusting God completely.

I'm going to talk about many different aspects of growing in hope. First, we can grow in hope ourselves. There's always room for improvement. Second, we can help those close to us and those we meet grow in hope. Lastly, we must share hope with the world. For some of us, helping others grow in hope may be easier than spreading hope to the world. Others of us may be stronger in one field and weaker in another. That's perfectly fine. However, think about what we could do if all people were setting these goals. Imagine what we could do! I'm going to do my best to focus on each of these goals and hopefully, by the end of this, you'll feel more hopeful and connected to the Jubilee year. I hope you have a blessed week!



St. Francis and St. Clare Income Statement for July 1, 2024-June 30, 2025



Operating Revenue is income derived from sources related to the parish's everyday business operations. It is down less than 1% from last year.

Total Operating Revenue \$811,910


The regular collection-consists of weekly envelopes, plate, and parish second collections and online giving. Collections increased this year by almost 6%.

Auxiliary receipts includes memorials, candles, carillon bells and flowers. These receipts were down 6.6% from last year.

Fundraising income is the total income from, Festival, Summer Raffle Christmas Bazaar, and St. Pauly shed.

Program revenue is from sacramental programs and adult education.

Donations are both restricted and unrestricted funds.



Operational expense is the expenses that occurs in the everyday operation of the church. Our expenses were up about 3% this year.




