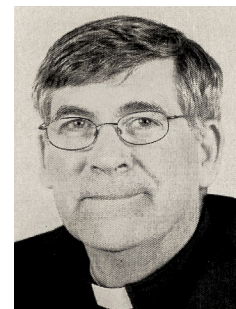

Carlo Acutis and Eucharistic Miracles

Carlo Acutis, as you may already know, was declared a saint by Pope Leo XIV not long ago. This 15-year-old boy, who died in 2006, was known for his dedication to Eucharistic miracles, using his computer skills to come up with a compilation of Eucharistic miracles from numerous countries. If you go to his website, www.carloacutis.com and go to the English translation, you can see for yourself the over 100 Eucharistic miracles that have occurred throughout the world, including the following countries: Argentina, Austria, Belgium, Colombia, Croatia, Egypt, France, Germany, India, Martinique, Reunion Islands, Italy, Mexico, Holland, Peru, Poland, Portugal, Spain and Switzerland. That is followed by *Saints, Mystics and the Eucharist*, *Our Lady and the Eucharist* and *Miraculous Communions*. Perhaps one of the most well-known and documented Eucharistic Miracles, was in Luciano, Italy. Carlo Acutis has a 49-minute animated video on that miracle, as well as insights into the Eucharist that you can view at www.miracolieucaristici.org/en/Video/video.html. It is a very well-done video that is well worth watching.

Eucharistic Miracle in Lanciano, Italy (8th Century, Circa 750)

The Miracle of Lanciano involved a priest who experienced doubts concerning Jesus' actual presence in the Eucharist. As he was leading Mass, he began to recite the words of consecration. As he said, "This is my body" and "This is my blood," he witnessed the wine and bread turn into real human blood and flesh. The blood then coagulated into five globules, which represented the five wounds of Christ. Word spread rapidly of this miracle, and the flesh and blood remain preserved to this day. You can visit them in the Lanciano's Church of San Francisco. There were scientific tests that were done in the 1970's that determined without a doubt, that the flesh was that of a heart muscle, and that the blood was definitely human blood, type AB. If you go to the website, you can click on every Eucharistic miracle that St. Carlo has researched. This young man was truly dedicated to the Holy Eucharist. No wonder he became a saint.

Pier Giorgio Frassati and the Eucharist

The Eucharist was absolutely central to Pier Giorgio's life. He received Christ with joy each morning in Holy Communion, and he carried Him forth to everyone he met throughout the rest of his day. Pier Giorgio knew that he could not rely on his own strength; rather, he sought to draw nearer to Jesus, that through relationship with Him and intimate communion, he might become a vessel for God in the world. He once wrote to his fellow young people, urging them to seek Jesus in the Eucharist:

And remembering that apostle of the Holy Eucharist, the Holy Father Pius X of venerable memory, I urge you with all the strength of my soul to approach the Eucharistic Table as often as possible. Feed on this Bread of the Angels from which you will draw the strength to fight inner struggles, the struggles against passions and against all adversities, because Jesus Christ has promised to those who feed themselves with the most Holy Eucharist, eternal life and the necessary graces to obtain it.

And when you become totally consumed by this Eucharistic Fire, then you will be able to thank with greater awareness the Lord God who has called you to be part of His flock and you will enjoy that peace which those who are happy according to the world have never tasted. Because true happiness, young people, does not consist in the pleasures of the world and in earthly things, but in peace of conscience which we can have only if we are pure in heart and in mind.

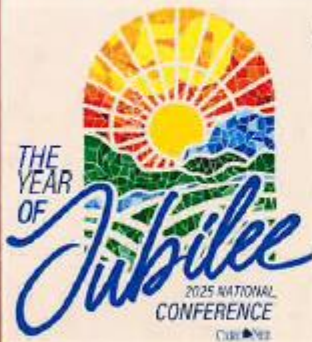
